Operations Report

Tenacity is to have will in face of extreme difficulty. It is the ability to implement a solution, analyze it and most importantly, adjust it. WCSS has continually adapted our operations to meet the changing needs of our changing community. Below are some everyday numbers which reflect how we have persisted in delivery of service. We have found the tenacity to do this even though we have been masked; even though we have been 2 meters a part; even though we have been working remote and even though the novel Coronavirus has continued to affect our lives in myriad of ways. We, TOGETHER, as a community of donors, partners, volunteers, and clients have continued to lift people up and change the way we live our lives. We are grateful to be able to continue our work of cultivating safe spaces for continued growth and well-being as we support and advocate for a healthy community.

On average, every day we...

- Serve 235 people a day in our stores
- Sell 24 pairs of shoes and 92 pieces of sports equipment
- Keep a metric tonne of pre-loved goods out of the landfill
- Collect 4,739 refundable bottles a day
- Provide mental and emotional support to 14 people in person or virtually.
- Feed 16 people at the foodbank
- 109 school aged kids receive lunch or snacks.
- 85 kg of food is rescued or donated everyday.
- 60 tools are lent out every day and every other day someone signs up to be a member
- Answer the phone 27 times a day. 60% of these are for Outreach services
- We spend \$21.56 at the landfill every day to dispose of unusable items donated at the stores that could not be sold or recycled
